## CHARLOTTE SENIOR SEMINAR STUDENTS EXPERIENCE JOB SHADOW



Charlotte High School students
enrolled in Senior Seminar class
taught by Mrs. Tina VanSyckle, had

shadowing for a day. Students spent
the work day experiencing the "real
world" in a career of their choice.

Shadow mentors were asked to spend a few minutes emphasizing the importance of these skills in their workplace, and to evaluate the student on their arrival time, appropriate dress, and performance during the job shadow experience.
