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Charlotte Middle School Welcomes Sheriff's Deputy VanCore



On Thursday, January 12th, Deputy Jon VanCore visited Charlotte Middle School to speak to 8th grade U.S. History classes about the Constitution, Bill of Rights, and Law Enforcement. Eighth grade students had the opportunity to better understand their individual rights, as well as how our law enforcement officials work to protect all of our safety, while at the same time obeying the law.

Deputy VanCore stayed the entire day to make real world connections for our students. He explained the importance and limitations of freedom of speech and protest, discussed his experience with the 2nd amendment and our right to bear arms, and talked about the difference between search and seizure in and out of school. Bryce Corkwell, an 8th grade student interested in exploring law enforcement as a career said that he learned several things from Deputy VanCore and hearing about his experiences make him want to pursue this as a career even more.

This was a great experience for our students to ask questions and become better informed. We thank Deputy VanCore and the Eaton County Sheriff Department for their willingness to share their day with Charlotte Middle School students.
